Village Precept

This is the funding allocated to the Parish Council by North Yorkshire Council for the upkeep of the village and its assets.

The Village Green and Track

The Village is part of a conservation area, and the Village Green is administered by Ravensworth Parish Council, which is responsible for its maintenance, protection and upkeep. All matters relating to the Village Green should be referred to the Parish Council. As custodians, the Parish Council must ensure that the Village Green is protected against encroachment, damage and uses other than those consistent with the normal enjoyment of the Village Green. Driving, cycling, motorcycles, or parking of any motorised or horse drawn vehicles on any part of the Village Green is legally not permitted. No horse riding nor grazing of livestock is permitted. Maintenance and repairs relating to the Village Green will only be carried out by contractors appointed to undertake such works by the Parish Council. The track around the Village Green is not a public highway. It was never designed for use by vehicles and so the surface, which is made up of shingle, suffers considerably from the volume of use it now gets. Residents will appreciate that the annual precept is insufficient to fund the upkeep of the track in any meaningful way. A particular problem is caused when large vehicles travel at speed up and down the track, not only leading to the damage of an already vulnerable surface but also endangering the lives of those using it.

The Parish Council asks that the following points be borne in mind regarding the Village Green and Track:

- children and residents are entitled to use the Village Green for recreation purposes
- the speed limit for travelling along the track is 5 mph
- Vehicles, motorcycles etc must not be driven across the village green
- if residents have off-road parking, this should be used instead of the Village Green
- if there is no alternative, those parking on the Village Green must understand that they do so without permission. They should have regard to the damage that will be caused due to poor weather conditions and do everything possible to negate this. If your vehicle is on the grass, please drive on and off it slowly to avoid causing any damage
- only vehicles that are taxed, tested and insured should travel along the track or be parked on/in the vicinity of the Village Green.

Village Hall Bookings and Availability

Our Village Hall has now been refurbished and is an excellent facility to hire for celebration events and other gatherings.

The following regular events also take place: Art & Craft Group – Monday 2:00 to 4:00 pm; Yoga – Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday – 6:30 to 7:30 pm; Samba Drums – Monday evenings; Soup and Sweet lunches – 3rd Thursday each month (Joan Hawes – 07870654531).

Residents are offered discounted rates for hiring the Village Hall.

Public Transport

There are at least 5 buses travelling daily on weekdays between Ravensworth, Barningham, Barnard Castle, Newsham, Kirby Hill, Gilling West and Richmond, with an adjusted timetable at weekends. This service is provided by Hodgson Coaches.

The pick-up point in both directions at Ravensworth is adjacent to the Bay Horse. A detailed timetable is available from <u>www.hodgsonsbuses.com</u> There is also a printed copy of the timetable on the road signpost at the pick-up point.

Dog Bins

There are three dog bins in the village:

- near the seat on the top side of the Village Green
- at the entrance to Tofta (first road on the left as you leave the village, heading towards Richmond)
- outside the Village Hall

It has been an ongoing concern of residents that some dog owners do not always clean up after their pets. This is a particular problem given that children play on the Village Green and in the surrounding countryside.

We simply ask that everybody cleans up after their pets and uses the bins provided!

Oil Club

Nigel Bateman kindly co-ordinates our Oil Club. He arranges deliveries approximately 4 times a year, having rung around the oil companies to get their best price for a bulk purchase. He sends out an email asking club members to let him know if they wish to receive any oil that month. Defibrillator

Ravensworth has a defibrillator, located on the Village Hall wall. It can be accessed by 'phoning 999 in an emergency and asking the Ambulance Service for the access code. There are clear instructions on the defibrillator about its use. The equipment will not shock somebody who is breathing, so there is no need to be frightened to use it. Defibrillators are proven to help save lives. See separate sheet for more information.
